Dr. Susan Culp, DVM

Extension Veterinarian

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service
Institute for Infectious Animal Diseases (IIAD)

Susan Culp is a veterinarian for the Institute for Infectious Animal Diseases (IIAD) and serves as a subject matter expert in companion animal veterinary medicine, livestock and poultry regulatory issues, and animal disaster response for Texas A&M AgriLife Research.



Culp was born in Minnesota and moved to Texas in 1983 where she later pursued and obtained her Bachelor's degree in Science and Wildlife Biology

at Texas State University in 1996. In 2001, she graduated from the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M University and shortly after practiced small animal medicine and surgery in Austin, TX.

Before her role at IIAD, Culp previously served as a Staff Veterinarian for the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) in Austin, TX where she was responsible for the development, implementation, and management of the TAHC Authorized Personnel Program for veterinarians and non-veterinarians.

In January 2020, Culp assumed an AgriLife Extension position as co-lead for the Veterinary Science Certificate Program (VSCP).



Dr. Culp currently lives in Georgetown, TX with her husband, one dog, 31-year old Yellow-Naped Amazon Parrot, 8 chickens, and 3 beehives. Her hobbies include beekeeping, hiking, and enjoying the outdoors.

Culp's interests include birds, insects, and plants, specifically native Texas plants. Her passion for bats is incontestable as she is a member of Bat Conservation International and attends member nights at Bracken Cave every year.
